9. Meeting all requirements of the approved Use-on-Review development plan.

10. A final plat application based on this concept plan will not be accepted for review by the MPC until certification of design plan approval has been submitted to the MPC staff.

Comments:

A concept plan for Copperstone Subdivision was approved by MPC on April 10, 2003. That plan proposed a detached single family subdivision containing 131 lots. The project was being developed with two differing lot sizes to accommodate the differing building types. There were 87 large lots that contained approximately .5 acre each. The other 44 lots in the project were smaller and the homes on those lots would be permitted to build up to the property line with a minimum of 5' separation between each dwelling. Since the approval of that concept plan, the subdivision has been partially developed and seventy-nine lots have been approved and recorded.

The applicant is now requesting to change the concept plan for the remaining acreage. The plan as approved would have permitted 52 additional dwellings on the site. The applicant is now proposing a concept plan for 85 lots on the remainder of this site. The larger lots in this unit will range in size from 10,000 to 15,000 sq. ft rather than the .5 acre lots approved previously. The small lots will be the same size as previously approved. The revised plan proposes 32 small lots and 53 of the larger lots.

With the combination of lot sizes and the retention of the existing large home on the tract, the development density of this project is 1.98 du/ac. Development at this density is well within the permitted density of the zoning and it is compatible with the other development found in the area.

EFFECT OF THE PROPOSAL ON THE SUBJECT PROPERTY, SURROUNDING PROPERTY AND THE COMMUNITY AS A WHOLE

1. The proposed subdivision will have minimal impact on local services since all utilities are in place to

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serve this site.

- 2. The proposed detached single-family subdivision is consistent in use and density with the recent zoning and subdivision development in the area.
- 3. Access to this project will be limited to Harvey Rd. via the internal road system of the project.

CONFORMITY OF THE PROPOSAL TO CRITERIA ESTABLISHED BY THE KNOX COUNTY ZONING ORDINANCE

- 1. The proposed detached single-family subdivision meets the standards for development within the PR (Planned Residential) Zone and all other requirements of the Zoning Ordinances.
- 2. The proposed subdivision is consistent with the general standards for uses permitted on review: The proposed development is consistent with the adopted plans and policies of the General Plan and Sector Plan. The use is in harmony with the general purpose and intent of the Zoning Ordinance. The use is compatible with the character of the neighborhood where it is proposed. The use will not significantly injure the value of adjacent property. The use will not draw additional traffic through residential areas.
- 3. The recommended density of this site is 1-3 dwellings per acre. The proposed 1.98 du/ac is within the permitted zoning density.

CONFORMITY OF THE PROPOSAL TO ADOPTED PLANS

1. The Southwest County Sector Plan identifies this property as low density residential with a maximum density of 5 du/ac. The PR zoning approved for this site allows a density up to 3 du/ac. which is consistent with the Sector Plan and the other development found in the area.
